L'Anse Township Board**

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Aura Fire Department Report—the last meeting was held on March 21. Fire agreement with the Village of L'Anse—nothing new to report; prior agreement remains in place. Parks and Cemeteries—The opening date has been set; employees remain the same; A-1 Toilets will need to be contacted; The Village will need to be contacted for water turn on and dock installation. Zoning/Planning—Trustee Maki is the liaison; the committee had a session with Pat Coleman of UPEA; they will review the master plan and zoning; On Wednesday, May 16 they will meet with Pat Coleman. Amendments for the planning commission motion carried by unanimous vote—1 ½ mile set back. Ambulance Report—Shelley Lloyd is the liaison. Assessing Report—the assessor has been working on the Shopko circumstances on square foot value; at \$56.00 per square foot and \$725,000.00 in taxable value. BCCMTA—The next meeting will be Monday, June 18 at 6:00 pm.

NEW BUSINESS:

The board approved contacting the DEQ to get a plan for erosion control in the park below the gazebo and repairs to Second Sand Beach Road. Some discussion on the Recreation Plan with the clerk to contact Bill Olsen at UPEA. Canyon Falls Trail Project—A letter was received from the PHF Foundation informing us that they will not be funding trail repairs as requested; this is part of the North Country Trail. Sending our condolences to the family of Bob Larson who recently passed away—Bob was a dedicated member of the planning/zoning board and will be missed. Designated Supervisor Magaraggia and/or Trustee Maki to correspond with Attorney Holmier regarding any planning/zoning issues. Accepted the recommendation from the L'Anse Township Election Commission to accept the slate of election inspectors for the August 7 and November 6 elections. Replaced Donald Baril on the Planning and Zoning Board. And, appointed Kristin Kahler, James McPhillips, and James Ekdahl to the pLanning and Zoning Board.
